Calvary Celebrates 115th Anniversary

Calvary Baptist Church turns 115 years old on Saturday, November 17, 2012 and we are planning a grand celebration! Calvary Ordains First African American Woman

On September 22, 2012 at 4:00 PM, history was made when Minister Linda Watkins became the first African American woman to be ordained at Calvary Baptist Church. Close to eighty people and over fifteen clergy attended the sacred ceremony held in Calvary's great and beautiful historical Sanctuary. On that day, Minister Watkins became a Reverend through Calvary, American Baptist Churches of Rhode Island (ABCORI), and American Baptist Churches USA (ABCUSA).

Ordination is the acknowledgment and commission by a community of believers that a person has been called to ministry. The title "Pastor" is the role in which a minister serves. A Pastor within the ABCUSA denomination is an ordained minister. An ordained minister is recognized as having been called as a Pastor by God. Based on




interviews with long-time Calvary members, Rev. Watkins is the first pastor to be ordained at Calvary in over fifty years.

The Spirit-filled service included traditional and contemporary music, from classic hymns to Gospel hits sung by our Gospel Choir. Associate Minister Michelle Sullivan sang a moving rendition of "My Tribute," accompanied Joan Schoonmaker on piano.

Sowing Seeds for Christ

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Tithing has often been misinterpreted and misunderstood. Many in the church view it as a legalistic requirement. Some consider it a burdensome duty rather than an opportunity for the joyful expression of praise. Some view tithing as an investment, assuming that the more they give, the more they'll get. Some see tithing as a requisite proof of redemption, as a sort of good work that is exacted as the price of salvation. For those who hold such a perspective, consciously or unconsciously, tithing can become very problematic. They experience guilt if they feel they may not have given enough, and they become complacent or even arrogant if they feel they have contributed lavishly. We pervert the concept of the tithe if we imagine ten percent to be a magic number that guarantees some kind of relationship with God.

If we focus too narrowly on a specific percentage, we wind up tangled in all manner of details. Do we tithe net or gross income? Do contributions to charities count as part of the tithe? These are not irrelevant issues as such. We do well to give some thought to how we assess the gifts that we have been given and which ministries are worthy of our support. But the point is that if we are looking to cut our losses when it comes to tithing, then we have got it all wrong. Legalistic interpretations can quickly kill the spirit of gratitude that should be motivating us to tithe in the first place. We should approach tithing as an expression of Christian grace, rather than as a device for earning redemption. Tithing is a response, not a requirement. The progression of stewardship

toward and beyond the tithe can be a discipline that frees us to comprehend the fullness of the gospel and the riches of God's grace. Properly handled, tithing is a vital step in Christian discipleship.

As we approach the 115th Anniversary of Calvary Baptist Church, please be in prayer that all people will keep in mind that tithing is:

- a source of blessing in our relationship with God;
- symbolic of putting God first;
- an act of gratitude for an expression of commitment to God's work;
- an important element in Christian discipleship;
- a help in reordering priorities, establishing God's rightful place in our lives;
- capable of extending the church's witness and service through ministries near and far;
- able to free us from being vulnerable to greed, and to develop in us a new spirit of generosity in all things.



It is the Christian way to give because we love, even as God loved us...and then gave. *"But those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint."* -Isaiah 40:31

Health and Wellness

Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, which you have from God, and that you are not your own? For you were bought with a price; therefore glorify God in your body. -1 Corinthians 6:19-20

As a Health and Physical Education teacher in the Providence Public School District, I see everyday what our society has become in terms of health and wellness. A lot of what I see doesn't look good.

More than 35% of adults in the United States are obese (30 pounds or more overweight), and childhood obesity has more than tripled in the past 30 years. Often, as a physical education teacher, I find that if a parent is overweight, the children in the family are or will be obese. This is sad because there are medical conditions that will arise because of the extra weight.

Obesity related conditions include heart disease, type 2 diabetes, certain types of cancer, and stroke. However, they can be prevented with a healthy diet and

regular exercise!

Along with this increase in the number of people who are overweight there are higher medical costs involved. Medical costs for people who are obese are almost \$1500 per year higher than people of normal weight.

So what is the key to not becoming obese? Two things: diet and exercise. Adults in the home should be setting a good example in these areas. Eating more fruits and vegetables is very important. Not only are they lower in calories than junk foods, they also will help your body work better! Adding more activity to your day is another way to help burn off more calories. Take a walk with yourself, a pet, spouse, children, friend, or others. Make it a daily habit.

Remember, God has given us a body and it is the temple of the Holy Spirit. Glorify God by taking care of your body.
