


From the Pastor to You


CALVARY SPELLING BEE TEAM MAKES FOURTH ROUND

CALVARY 2013 FINANCIAL OVERVIEW

Glory be to God who is good all the time. He has blessed us with a faithful congregation and friends of Calvary once again during 2013. Our total receipts for the year were \$238,428 and total expenses were \$237,093 leaving us with a surplus of \$1,335. Thank you for your faithfulness and especially our prayers for our continued ministries.

Envelopes, open collections and fellowship tithes and offerings totaled \$147,063 for the year which makes up nearly 62% of our receipts. Other receipts are from collections of rent, building use and amounts we draw from our invested funds to help pay the operating expenses.

We have also been blessed by gifts from our far away Calvary members who have given us funding for capital projects and college scholarships to some of our youth. We have received a \$48,300 grant from the Champlin Foundation in December for external repairs/upgrades to the masonry, roof and windows.

It is important to remember that we need our members and friends of Calvary to continue to remain faithful so we can continue to minister to God's people through our ministries and that of South Providence Neighborhood Ministries who reaches over 12,000 needy people each year. In addition to our ministries, missions, and payroll associated expenses, we use contributions to pay the many expenses associated with our church home that totaled \$89,192 in 2013. We have reduced our building mortgage from \$350,000 in 2005 down to \$64,000 in 2014 with your contributions. The monthly payment is \$781 that we need to pay for the next twelve years. Please remember to continue to contribute to our building fund to help pay our mortgage off once and for all.

Exciting things are happening at Calvary in 2014 and again we want to thank you so much for being part of our church family. Blessings to you and your family.

Instructions for a one day (12-hour Fast)

Lenten Season begins March 5, 2014, 6:00 AM-6:00 PM

Lenten Season is the time of prayer and fasting 40 days before Resurrection Sunday. Basic fasting is abstaining from food and/or other things for a particular time in order to cleanse your body, mind, and spirit. Through it God will help you “work out your soul salvation with fear and trembling (Philippians 2:12)” and help you get closer to Him. Fasting is done to sacrifice something that preoccupies you in order to return your focus towards God.

The Bible does not give specific instructions on how to fast but discusses it often (i.e. St. Matthew 17:21). Over the years, people have developed many different types of fasts. We are participating in a 12 hour fast on March 5, 2014 from 6 AM-6PM: Also, everyone is invited to join us in a special time of prayer from 12-1 p.m. wherever you are all throughout the Lenten Season.

Here are some basic instructions for a 12 - hour fast:

- Pray for God’s guidance as to what is the best way to fast.
- Consult a physician, health practitioner, and/or someone else who has successfully fasted before beginning any fast on your own. Perhaps choose a group of others with whom to fast and pray.
- Develop a transition plan such as eating one light, well rounded meal per day prior to attempting the one day fast (i.e. salads, raw vegetables, fruits, berries, seeds and nuts for protein) (Marc Leduc, 2002; Burroughs).
- Most practitioners recommend juice fasts over water fasts to maintain needed nutrients, calories, and other necessary ingredients the body needs (Leduc, 2002). Use freshly squeezed juices whenever possible.
- Once you decide to fast, pray for the Lord’s strength to endure it. Then do not eat 3 hours prior to going to bed. Next, do not eat your regular meals during the twelve-hour period. Note: Please maintain water and juice intake during the fast from food. After 6 p.m. you may have a light snack from the above list. After this one-day fast you may resume regular eating with smaller portions the next day. When transitioning back to regular eating **start slowly**.

Longer Fasts

If you desire to continue this fasting experience during the entire Lenten Season, longer fasts require a longer transition period back to regular eating. For further instructions regarding longer fasts, order the books *The Commonsense Guide to Fasting* by Rev. Kenneth E. Hagin, Sr., *The Lemonade Diet* by Stanley Burroughs, and/or *Fasting for A Spiritual Breakthrough: A Guide to Nine Biblical Fasts* by Rev. Dr. Elmer L. Towns. Whatever your decision, make it a prayerful one and follow God’s leading.

AMERICA FOR CHRIST OFFERING

“Learn to do good; seek justice, rescue the oppressed, defend the orphan, plead for the widow.” Isaiah 1:17

This year’s theme for the America for Christ Offering is *“Seek Justice,”* which is a biblical reminder that Jesus’ public ministry was all about advocacy, engagement and compassion for people in need. Through the work of American Baptist Home Mission Societies (ABHMS), which is supported by the America for Christ Offering, we can participate with our Lord in seeking justice for those in our churches and neighborhoods. Did you know the following?

- In 2011, the official poverty rate was 15 percent, with 46.2 million people in poverty (U.S. Census Bureau).
- Immigrants largely arrive through legal channels. Foreign-born people in the United States numbered 39.9 million in 2010: 44 percent were naturalized citizens; 24 percent were legal permanent residents; 29 percent were unauthorized migrants; and 3 percent were temporary legal residents, such as students or temporary workers (Center for American Progress).
- Approximately 6 million students in grades seven through 12 are struggling to read at grade level. Among the highest, 70 percent of eighth graders read below the standard (Alliance for Excellent Education).

Our mission and ministries are needed now more than ever. The America for Christ Offering 2014 supports churches, neighborhood action programs, advocacy, training and community impact by facilitating leadership workshops and conferences, promoting discipleship resources and providing opportunities for churches, individuals and youth groups to participate in home missions.

Special Offering Envelopes will be provided in the worship experience bulletins during the month of March for your contributions. Together, we can change lives as we “seek justice” as followers of Jesus Christ.

BUILDING AND GROUNDS UPDATE

As most of you know, we have been very busy in the Building and Grounds department lately. This flurry of activity is mainly due to the generosity of a former member, the estate of another former member, and the Champlin Foundation Grant that we received in December.

The repair and restoration of the dome over the altar has been completed. The damaged plaster was repaired, two coats of primer paint were applied, a coat of sand textured paint was applied followed by two coats of gold paint and finally, a sponge application of copper colored paint was applied. In addition, we replaced all of the lights behind the Rood Screen with energy efficient, but bright, flood lights, creating a brilliant effect that we have not seen in a very long time. This restoration was made possible by a \$5,000 bequest from the estate of Brenda Leach. At the very beginning of our first Capital Campaign back in 2005, our former Pastor Reverend Linda Spoolstra had connected with Mrs. Leach and she has been quite generous towards Calvary since then.

In the Spring, we intend to replace all of the carpeting throughout the Sanctuary, including the platform and altar area. I know, we'll all miss the duct taped seams and rippled and stained carpeting, but we'll just have to get through this together! This project was made possible by a \$10,000 donation by a former member who wishes to remain anonymous at this time.

Finally, the exterior repairs of the roof, the wooden window frames, and the masonry were begun in January and are on hold now until the weather breaks just a little, sometime in March. These much needed repairs are being funded by a \$48,000 grant from the Champlin Foundations. Champlin has also been very generous to Calvary since 2005 when we received an initial grant of \$203,000 which enabled us to replace a good portion of the old slate roof with new slate.

As you can see, we have many people who donate special gifts to Calvary. We in the Building and Finance Committees will continue to apply these gifts to projects and ministries that we feel are our most pressing needs. Our grateful thanks goes out to all those who have made these projects possible.

Stewardship of Money and Possessions Tithing and Beyond in 2014

Dear Calvary – These three faces of stewardship help to remind us of God’s love, expectation and faith in us as His people. Please pray that we will honor these three steps as faithful stewards of Jesus Christ.

The three faces of stewardship:

- **Ordinary Stewardship** is the regular practice of returning to God a portion of all that God has given us. It involves teaching ourselves how to create a life built upon the notion that all that we have is a gift from God. This includes teaching the holy habits of keeping Sabbath and tithing and the concept that giving regularly of our time, talent, and money to God's work on this earth is as much a spiritual practice as prayer and worship.
- **Extraordinary Stewardship** involves the special occasions that arise in the life of Christian communities that call us to give beyond our ordinary habit. They involve increased risk and encourage us to experiment with sacrificial giving in order to help the community realize an especially important goal. The best example of extraordinary stewardship is the capital campaign.
- **Legacy Stewardship** is the way in which we address the matter of disposing of the accumulations of our lifetime. Who will use your stuff, when you no longer need it? It is the opportunity to leave a planned gift that constitutes both a legacy to generations yet unborn and a final witness to those whom we hold most dear.
