From the Pastor to You



Hello Calvary Family! Happy New Year! As we embark on the year of our Lord 2016, we breathe a sigh of relief that we have made it to see another year. Most of us look forward to the New Year with great anticipation based on the blessings of the last year. Others are a little more tentative about their approach to what lies ahead due to great losses they suffered in years past. No matter your prospective, cheerful or tearful, transitions don't always have to be scary. They often provide new possibilities. Learn to take the good and bad experiences of your life in the context of shaping the journey of who you are or will become.

No one can escape hardship but we can decide not to let it cripple us from moving forward. In Psalm 30, the writer praises the Lord for rescuing him from certain death. The pain was unbearable. The danger was real. Many tears of anguish flowed. The healing was delayed. However, in the final analysis, the Psalmist concluded, "*O, Lord my God, I will give thanks to You forever*" (v. 12). Your danger, pain, and tears are real. You may have to experience great anguish but through it all, you must continue to believe that God is with you. Be comforted in the fact that "*weeping may endure for a night but joy comes in the morning*" (Psalm 30:5, KJV). You may have to cry for however long your night is but joy will come in the morning and sometimes through the *mourning*. I know it's hard to believe God is with you when you are in the middle of your storm but stay anchored in the Lord and when the winds and rains pass, you "*shall never be moved*" (Psalm 30:6).

May God grant your family and you peace and assurance this year. God bless you.

Dear Brothers and Sisters of Christ,

Jesus' teachings and how they speak to us today calls His followers to share, to respond to the poor, the hungry, the destitute, the homeless, the widowed, the prisoners. To one inquiring young man he said, *"If you wish to be perfect, go, sell your possessions, and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me"* (Matthew 19:21).

In the Debt-Free Living class that Sue Colantonio and David Dromsky are teaching now, we recently learned that an act of giving is an acknowledgement of the very essence of God, the One who is the greatest giver of all. *"For God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son."* Everything about God revolves around His giving. How important is the act of giving? Did you know that the subject of prayer is mentioned about 500 times in the Bible. Faith is written about approximately 500 times, but the subjects of material things, tithing, and giving are written about 1,000 times! Did you know that 16 out of the 38 parables of Jesus deal with money, possessions, their use, and their relationship to us? And that one out of every six verses in Matthew, Mark, and Luke deal with stewardship? In 2 Corinthians, there is one chapter on the resurrection of Jesus Christ and three chapters devoted to the subject of when and how to give.

In the Debt-Free Living booklet we are using in the class, it states that while Jesus was on the earth, he tithed (St Mark 12: 15-17). He said, *"I came not to destroy the law but to fulfill the law!"* He was accused of many things, but not once was He accused of violating the law of tithing.

God is encouraging giving – *"It is more blessed to give than to receive"* (Acts 20: 24-36). He himself provided a model for sharing. He advocated making special efforts to care for the poor and destitute. He is far less concerned about the amount a person gives then about the spirit that lay behind the giving – as in the case of the widow's mite (St. Luke 21: 1-4). He recommended simple values. He taught that treasures in heaven are more important than treasures on earth (St. Matthew 61: 9-21). He was completely committed to the belief that God is the owner of everything. He condemned ostentatious giving. He gave out of love.

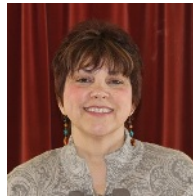
