From the Pastor –

Hello Calvary Family,

I pray this edition of the Calvary Call reaches you basking in the glory of the Lord. Certainly, we are grateful that God has provided a milder winter for us this year as we transition to Spring. This year we look for God to continue to “Spring” forth new life into our ministry. But you know, God is constantly offering us opportunities to walk with Him in the flow of His creation. In the beginning when God breathed into Adam and Eve and made them a living soul, He presented the Garden as a place to grow and provide growth (Genesis 1:27-28; 2:7, 16). This new growth would replenish the earth and yield a bountiful harvest for everyone. As Christians we are in a unique place to still yield a harvest of souls. However, before the harvest comes, we must do something. We must prepare for it. For example, it’s not enough to ask, “Why don’t we have new members at our church like we did years ago?” We have to rediscover our roots of faith. People come to church to meet Jesus. Jesus says, “Go.” He says, Go in my authority over the universe! Go make disciples of all nations! Go, baptize them. Go teach them to obey my commandments that I have command you! If you are truly a disciple of Jesus there should be some action to your faith. Is there any growth in you or around you? Have you led anyone to Jesus since He saved you? Have you walked with authority and taught them to obey His commandments as He taught you? Do you know His commandments (St. John 13:34-35; St. John 15:11-15)?

Be honest with yourself and take a moment to assess where you are in your walk with Christ. If you find there are some areas you lack in discipleship, ask God’s forgiveness and seek opportunities to follow Jesus. One such opportunity to grow is joining us on Wednesday nights for prayer at 6:30 p.m. Another opportunity is to join us in our small group Discipleship study series on Wednesdays at 7:00 p.m. in the Tomlin Room. You have a detailed repository of excuses as to why you “can’t” come to pray and study God’s Word, now it’s time to take seriously your growth in Christ so that the world will know that the Savior lives and still saves today. 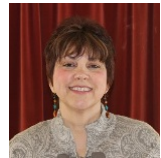

TREASURY UPDATE

Calvary's financial health over the first two months of 2016 has been encouraging, but we still have quite a way to go. As a reminder, our budget for the year has a \$30,000 deficit financed by drawing down invested funds—our emergency fund. Spending has been as low as possible without making some radical changes, so the focus remains on revenue—tithes and offerings in particular. The first three months break down as follows:

Additionally, the Youth Program is fully-funded for the year. The shortfall in Envelopes has been covered by higher-than-anticipated Open Collections and Special Gifts, plus fairly robust giving to the Fellowship Fund (Initial and Communion Offerings), leaving us not quite \$1,000 ahead of plan. All else being equal, that represents a \$1,000 reduction in the amount we'll have to withdraw from invested funds. Hopefully, the congregation and the offering will continue to grow through the Spring and Summer, making such withdrawals unnecessary.

KITCHEN RENOVATION PROJECT

Our church kitchen, that serves not only Calvary and Iglesia Bautista Hispana El Calvario but also South Providence Neighborhood Ministries for after school programs and summer camp, is in dire need of repairs/renovations. As you can see from the photos, it has been quite a while so we will be sending out an appeal letter to charitable organizations and the congregation to help with this important project. We plan to bring the kitchen up to code by replacing ceiling tiles and wall board, repairing and painting the cabinets, putting in a new subfloor and flooring and installing new laminate countertops as well as upgrades to electrical and plumbing. We also need to cover the butcher block with stainless steel or remove it because it doesn't meet safety standards. We would also like to install a used industrial dishwasher and a refrigerator that would better serve SPNM. We have already received a donated industrial stove. The cost of the renovations is approximately \$12,000.

We pray that the congregation contribute half the cost and look to outside funding for the other half. We want to have the project completed before the SPNM children's summer program and vacation Bible school. Please open your hearts to help us fund this very important renovation. Please make checks payable to Calvary Baptist and write kitchen renovation in the memo section. Thank you so much for your help.
