THE RAMBLING OF PASTOR REPPA

Dear Calvary Family Members and Friends,

March 31, 2021

Last night as I was taking the dogs outside, I noticed there was no moon. I thought that was strange, since on Sunday was the full moon. That is of course why Easter is this coming Sunday. Easter is the first Sunday after the first full moon after the equinox.

I stood in the yard and looking at the sky when my eye caught a glow in the southeast. I looked at my watch and it was 10:02 pm. I was still for the next 5 minutes and watched the moon rise. It was absolutely beautiful. This made me start thinking about how people will get up early to watch the sunrise, but few people talk about the moonrise. There may be good reason for this. Of course, this is just my thinking.

The sunrise is a few minutes different from one day to the next. You know the direction the sun is going to rise and where it will set. I made the mistake one time thinking that the moon was just as predictable. It was an evening of a full moon; I and a friend of mine were sitting on one of the docks and she asked about staying and watching the moon rise. I encouraged her to do so and told her that “yesterday it was about 8:15pm so it should be about 8:20 or 8:25 tonight.”

We sat and talked and waited and talked and waited and then she asked if I really knew where the moon rose. I was sure of the place but certainly was doubting the timing since it was already 45 minutes late. (Reppa’s timing – not God’s) We did see the moon rise that night and it was beautiful, but I learned that night that the moon’s schedule is not as predictable as the sun’s.

Therefore, I started to check the scriptures for the moon and the sun. In the new testament the word sun is used 33 times and the word moon only 10 times.

⁴⁰ There are both heavenly bodies and earthly bodies, but the glory of the heavenly is one thing, and that of the earthly is another. ⁴¹ There is one glory of the sun, and another glory of the moon, and another glory of the stars; indeed, star differs from star in glory. ⁴² So it is with the resurrection of the dead. What is sown is perishable, what is raised is imperishable. I Cor, 15: 40 -41

Amazing, it is talking about our resurrection into the perfect presence of God. And then I checked out another reading, Rev. 21:23

And the city has no need of sun or moon to shine on it, for the glory of God is its light, and its lamp is the Lamb.

Yes, just taking the dogs out in the evening can give me the opportunity to see the beauty of the moonrise, which sent me to the scriptures that brings me right to the reason for Easter – Christ died that we may have eternal life and He Rose because not even death could hold Him. So, we are reminded that we will be raised imperishable and will see the **glory of God**. Praise the Lord.

May the lessons of Holy Week touch your Soul and may you be renewed in the light and the power of Christ.

Hymn History ~ "Christ the Lord Is Risen Today"

Charles Wesley, the co-founder of the Methodist Church, wrote "*Christ the Lord Is Risen Today*" in 1739 where it was initially titled "*Hymn for Easter Day*". He based it on an older anonymous Bohemian hymn titled "*Jesus Christ is Risen Today*".

The new hymn was first performed at the first service at The Foundery Meeting House after Wesley had adapted it into the first Methodist chapel. Following this, Wesley published it in the *Hymns and Sacred Poems* hymnal. It was initially written with eleven verses of four lines each. It was also published in *A Collection of Hymns for the Use of the People called Methodists* hymnal. The hymn was later edited by Martin Madan for inclusion in his *Psalms and Hymns* hymnal by removing the seventh, eighth and ninth verses.

The hymn eventually became popular in the Church of England from around 1780. Charles Wesley's brother, John Wesley excluded it from the Wesleyan Methodist Church's *Wesleyan Hymn Book*, which John did to preclude the inclusion of any specific seasonal hymns. It was not until 1831, when the *Supplement to the Collection* was published by an unknown Methodist, that "*Christ the Lord is Risen Today*" made it into the hymnals of the Methodist Church regularly.

Each verse of "*Christ the Lord Is Risen Today*" features a focus on the Resurrection of Jesus. For the final verse, Wesley uses descriptive language to describe four requirements for Christians to enjoy eternal life with God:

To know God, to bear witness to God, to sing their faith and to love one another.
